In 2018-19 we doubled the number of participants from 31 to 64. We had a small increase at 67% in the female participation verses the campus at 58%. Male participation of 33% decreased by 2% in 2018-19. In campus male student population in the same year was 42% and our goal is to reach that level in 2019 -2020. ETHNICITY: Due to the focus of the Umoja-Tumaini Program we have a higher number of African American students 73% than the 11% the campus represents in 2018-19. The program exhibited a decrease in African American student in 2018-2019. Even though our target population is African American (AA) students we do enroll other ethnicities that are interested in learning more about African American History and the AA experience. In the program Multi-Ethnicity 16% is higher has stayed the same over the last two years. SUCCESS: Umoja-Tumaini continues to demonstrate an increase in the success of the program students from at 2018-19 72%. **RETENTION:** The retention of program has remained the same 92% in 2017-18 and 2018-19. We will continue to work at keeping the student engaged in the program at a greater level.

- Collaborated with Puente and the sociology department to offer an Umoja-Tumaini-Puente supported Sociology course to be offered in SP2020.
- Partnered with the new Promise program to have African American students in that program to also be a part of Umoja-
- The program was able acquirer and create a community village space/one-stop called Nitasome which means in Swahili "I will learn". This space is designed to give students access tutoring, counseling, resources, computer space and assist in meeting challenges of typical program participants

Increase funding needed for program field trips, To attend Umoja Regional and State conferences, cultural events, hire Tutor III and purchase books; 5.Indentify Mental Health services resources that will address increased issues of African American students. **Opportunities:** 1. Identify additional transferable courses in which students can enroll using a blocked format; 2. Adopt an area high school to develop a pipeline to the program.; 3. Continue to develop partnerships with Puente and Promise program to provided Summer Bridge program; 4. Provide special topic workshops on financial literacy, managing stress, how to stay motivated and how to take responsibility for your learning.
