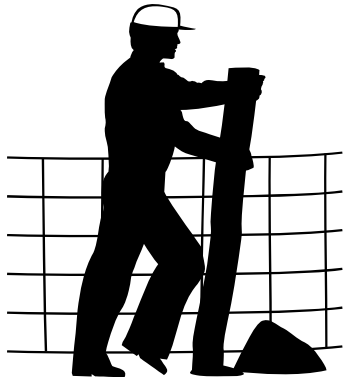

### NEWS FROM HURRICANE VICTIMS .... A first-hand experience

*Dear Denise,*

*I just wanted to share some information with you that made me very proud and I thought it would do the same for you. Last week I attended the League for Innovation in the Community College Conference with my dean, Zelma Russ. One of the keynote speakers for this event was Walter Bumphus, President Louisiana Community and Technical College System. In his speech he shared the devastation of Hurricane Katrina, but he also shared the great out pour of assistance that was received from college staff and students from across the country.*

*His office has developed a video to use as a tool for assisting its' people with the healing process. Within the video is a listing of all the colleges and college Associated Students who have contributed money and are yet contributing money to help the system and the people of Louisiana Community Colleges to get back on their feet. On that list standing tall with so many others is San Bernardino Valley College and its' Associated Students. Dr. Bumphus made it a point to tell us that these are monies that have actually been received. He said the Federal Government has pledged its money, but they have not received a dime from the government. But the community college community has come through for them and they are very grateful.*

## STATUS OF CONSTRUCTION, DEMOLITIONS, AND NEW BUILDINGS:



1. **Campus Center** is finally nearing completion with turn-over of the building to the campus anticipated for May 19. New furniture will be delivered in April and May. The formal move into the Campus Center will occur the week of May 22 to include:
  - **Cafeteria & Restaurant Management program**
  - **Bookstore**
  - **Campus Police**
  - **Student Activities / Student Government**
  - **CalWorks**
  - **SAP (Student Assistance Program)**
  - **Institutional Development & Foundation**
  - **Scholarships**
  - **Weekend College**
  - **Dean, Occupational Education & Extended Day**
  - **Grants Management**
  - **Research**
2. The new **Art Center** complex is also nearing completion but has been delayed. The new move-in date is set for the week of July 31.
3. The new **Child Care Center** continues to make progress towards an anticipated move occurring prior to the beginning of the fall semester.
4. The new **Student Health Services Center** has been delayed and will not be constructed by fall 2006 as planned. We are hopeful that the new modular structure will be ready by the beginning of spring semester, 2007.
5. Now that the demolitions are nearing completion, we will have an empty space the size of the Rose Bowl (over 18 acres) and shortly after the finals and commencement, construction begins on the parkway, which should take place throughout 2006-2007.
