Scholarship & Awards Brochure

Important Application Procedures

Scholarship applicants and those nominated must have completed 12 units at San Bernardino Valley College to apply for scholarships. At the time of application (in the fall) and selection (in the spring) the student must be enrolled in and complete at least 6 units at SBVC each semester. The student must also be enrolled in 6 or more units at a community college or university when he/she receives the funds. The number of units and the grade point average are competitive measures.

The brochure and applications are online. Application directions may be found at www.valleycollege.edu/scholarships. **Application dates are from October 19, 2009- January 25, 2010, by Noon.**

How to Apply for Scholarships

It is essential that you submit a completed application by the established deadline and that you meet the eligibility criteria. You must have average grades or better and must have completed 12 units at SBVC. Begin early! **You must request recommendations from your recommenders before the end of the fall semester** so they will have ample time to complete the questionnaire by the application deadline of January 25, 2010 at Noon.

You must have **two recommendation questionnaires** completed and submitted online:

- Two recommendations from instructors (one must be a current instructor)

or

- One recommendation from a (current) instructor and one from either a counselor or administrator.

We will only accept recommendation questionnaires from SBVC Instructors, Counselors or Administrators. Select someone who knows you and about your studies. Use a resume to inform them about your goals and accomplishments. The recommenders submit their recommendation questionnaires online. Students need to check periodically to be sure the recommendations have been submitted. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that all recommendations have been submitted on time. **Your application will not be accepted unless you have the two recommendations.**

Recommendation Letters

Provide enough time for a recommendation to be written. Schedule an appointment to discuss the recommendation and supply the recommender with as much information as possible.

You should provide the following information for the person recommending you.

- Your full name, school ID number, address, email and phone number as it appears on your application.

Recommendation Letters (con't)

- When you completed the class (fall/spring/summer), the year, and the grade you received.

Scholarship & Awards Brochure

- Information about your accomplishments at college or the community.
- Any community services or participation in college events.
- Inform the recommender that they go online and complete a short questionnaire about you.
- Write down the due date and time the recommendation has to be completed.
- If the recommender has questions or needs assistance in completing the recommendation they may contact the scholarship office: (909) 384-4471.

Biography

Your biography is limited to 300 words (the computer gives you the count). If you go beyond this, your biography will be cut off. TIP: Copy and paste your biography into the online space provided on the scholarship application website.

Scholarship & Awards Information

Scholarship and awards are only available to San Bernardino Valley College students **who have completed 12 units at SBVC**. Scholarship awards vary each year.

Amount of Scholarships

Scholarships generally range from \$100 to \$1,500. Recipients must claim their scholarships by February 5, 2011.

Selection of Recipients

Many more applications for scholarships will be received than can be awarded. **Only those applicants selected as scholarship recipients will be notified by email the last week in April.** Other applicants will **not** be notified. **Recipients will be invited to the Scholarship Awards Program in the spring, 2010.**

Scholarships Awarded by Non-Campus Organizations

Section I

Cancer Federation Scholarship

This scholarship is based on grades, community service, and dedication. Candidates must be biology majors who plan to research, become teachers or physicians or nursing majors.

Children's Fund Scholarship

Scholarships are awarded to students who are foster youth under the jurisdiction of the San Bernardino County Department of Children's Services or emancipated Foster Youth from San Bernardino County. Applicants must be under the age of 26, pursuing a certificate in an occupational or vocational program, maintaining a 2.5 grade point average or higher, and demonstrating financial need after exhausting all other sources of institutional financial support including federal aid (FAFSA).

The Community Foundation Scholarships, Riverside & San Bernardino

Scholarships are awarded to students in any major of study. The applicant must be: 1) a permanent resident of Riverside or San Bernardino Counties, 2) have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 (or 2.75 if enrolled in a certificate course in technical training), 3) enrolled in at least 6 units, and 4) be able to demonstrate financial need. The students apply in October through early November. The SBVC Scholarship Committee selects the recipients. They are awarded for the spring semester, 2009.

Datatel Scholarships

This scholarship is available for students who attend, or plan to attend, a college or university that is a Datatel client site. The applicant must have a 3.5 grade point average or higher. SBVC is a Datatel client and is allowed to nominate two semi-finalists each for the Datatel Scholars Foundation and Angelfire scholarships and one semi-finalist each for the Returning Student, the Nancy Goodhue Lynch Scholarship and, the Russ Griffith Memorial.

Rialto Rotary Club & Aleck H. B. Fergusson Family Technical Certificate Scholarship

Students who have completed at least one of the automotive certificate programs in good standing may apply for this scholarship. The Technical Division selects the recipients.

Please Note: *The scholarships announced in this section comprise a partial list of scholarships awarded by non-campus organizations, available to San Bernardino Valley College students. See the last page of this document for ways to apply for many other scholarships.*

Scholarships Awarded by Campus Organizations

Section II

The following scholarships are funded by campus organizations. Most recipients are determined by the sponsoring organizations, with amounts varying each year.

Alpha Gamma Sigma, Delta Chapter

Applicants must be active members of AGS and the Community College Honor Society for two semesters and have completed a minimum of 24 units with a grade point average of 3.25 or higher.

Associated Student Senate

Students who have completed 12 units or more at SBVC with a 2.5 cumulative grade point average or higher and who have demonstrated student leadership and involvement in campus activities may apply.

Caduceus Club

Applicants must be active members in the Caduceus Club and must have completed 12 or more units with a 3.0 grade point average or higher.

San Bernardino Community College District Black Faculty & Staff Association

The student must be enrolled in 12 or more units. He/she must have a 2.0 grade point average, meet graduation requirements, and must be a Liberal Arts or Vocational major.

San Bernardino Valley College Alumni Association

This scholarship is for students in any major who have completed 60 or more units by the end of the spring semester with a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher and who are active participants in campus and community activities.

San Bernardino Valley College Faculty Association

The Faculty Association awards scholarships to students who have completed at least one year at the college with a 3.0 or higher grade point average and who have participated in the life of the college outside of the classroom.

SBVC Classified Senate Scholarship

The student must be enrolled in a minimum of 9 units with a 2.5 grade point average. Must show that he/she has leadership qualities and must have participated in community service/activities. Two recommendations must be submitted: one by an SBVC faculty member and one by a classified employee.

SBVC ESL Club

Members of the English as a Second Language Club may apply. Participation in meetings and club activities is a requirement, as well as completion of one semester at SBVC in good academic standing, with at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average.

Scholarships Awarded by Campus Organizations

Section II, continued

San Bernardino Valley College Latino Faculty, Staff & Administrators Association

This scholarship is open to all SBVC students who hold a 2.5 or higher grade point average. He/she must have involvement in the community or college and have completed 30 or more transferable units.

SBVC Math Department

Applicants must have a 3.0 grade point average or higher, declare a math major and have completed Math 102 college algebra or above.

General & Memorial Scholarships

Section III

The donors or campus divisions/departments select the scholarship listed below.

James Q. Almaraz Memorial

This scholarship will be awarded to a past or present Puente student, with a 2.75 or higher grade point average. He/she must major in physical and biological science and must have completed 24 units of college work by the end of the spring semester. The instructors of the Puente Program select the recipient.

Don & Carol Averill Career & Technical Education Scholarship

The student must be enrolled in any of SBVC's technical education disciplines in a Certificate Program as a freshman or sophomore with a minimum 2.0 grade point average or higher.

Russell Baldwin Memorial

Exceptional music students who are specializing in Piano and intending to transfer to a four-year college may apply. The faculty in the music department will determine the recipients.

Jeffrey Berry Memorial

A scholarship is awarded annually to a student who has a long-term goal of working in a helping capacity with children or adults with physical, mental, or learning disabilities. Students preparing for careers in social work, case management, counseling rehabilitation counseling, vocational counseling, teaching, education or other careers consistent with the deadlines stated above are encouraged to apply. Applicants will be evaluated on their long-term goals and their progress toward those goals. Consideration will be given to both academic progress as measured by 20 units completed and grade average of 2.5 and by non-academic progress as indicated by experience in helping capacity as a volunteer or employee. A committee formed by the Disabled Students Programs and Services selects the recipients.

Bridgestone/Firestone Scholarship

The Bridgestone/Firestone Scholarship is limited to automotive and technician certificate students who have completed 12 or more units with a 2.5 or better grade point average. The Automotive Department will make the selections.

Harold Brown Memorial Scholarship

There are no specifications on the selection of this scholarship.

The Harold Chandler Memorial Scholarship

Applicants should be continuing/returning students who are considering Life Science as a major with a grade point average of 3.0 transferable units. The Science Department makes the selection.

G. A. T. O. (Giving Another the Opportunity) Scholarship

The applicant must be an African American student with a 2.0 grade point average who is pursuing Spanish as a second language. The Scholarship Committee, with help from the donor, will select the recipients.

Estelle Heydenfeldt Memorial Scholarship

Preference will be given to a returning student with a 3.0 grade point average or higher majoring in music. If applicants do not meet the above criteria, the scholarship may be used for a transfer student in any major. The selection is made by the Music Department.

General & Memorial Scholarships

Section III, continued

George Iwanaga Memorial Scholarship

Application is for students of Spanish, planning a career in teaching. Two semesters of Spanish Language courses must have been completed at SBVC with a minimum of a 3.0 grade point average. The Spanish Department makes the selections.

Library Media Services Certificate Scholarship

Applicants must have completed two courses in the Library Media Certificate program and have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher. The Dean of Learning Resources selects the scholarship recipient.

Lockheed Commercial Aircraft Center Scholarship

Applicants majoring in Aviation Maintenance Technology must be completing the first year of either the Airframe or Powerplant Curriculum. Applicants must have in their possession either the Federal Aviation Administration Airframe or Powerplant Certificate, prior to receiving the scholarship, and have a grade point average of 2.75 or higher. Special consideration may be given to students who are working while attending college. The Aeronautics Department selects the recipients.

The Griffin McNeily Chemistry Scholarship

This scholarship is for students majoring in chemistry. A freshman, sophomore or transfer student may be selected who has a 2.5 or better grade point average. The selection will be made by the SBVC Chemistry Department.

Sandra Marquez – Men & Women in Technology Scholarship

This scholarship will be awarded to a student that is participating in a certificate or degree program in a technical area. The student must be in the second semester or beyond and demonstrate a need. A minimum grade point average of 2.0 is required and the student must be in good standing in the program. The Applied Technology & Transportation Division selects the recipient.

Juliann Martin Commitment to Children and Families Scholarship

This scholarship is for Child Development majors who have completed their requirements for the Associate Teacher Certification in Child Development. The recipient must be a single parent facing financial challenges. The Child Development Department selects the recipient.

Patti & Stephen Obershaw Memorial

Students majoring in music or actively engaged in performance who have completed a minimum of 12 units with a grade point average of 2.0 or higher may apply. The Music Department selects the recipients.

Phenix Award

Candidates must be Human Services majors in the Certificate Program with a 2.5 grade point average. The recipient will be selected by the Human Services faculty and staff members.

General & Memorial Scholarships

Section III, continued

C. Dale Robbins Memorial Scholarship

Returning students with an academic emphasis in vocal/choral music may apply. Students must have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher. The Choir Director selects the recipients.

Dr. Donald M. Rusk Memorial

Rusk scholarships are awarded to students concentrating in Human Services who have completed 15 or more units in Human Services and Sociology with a grade point average of 3.0 or higher. Selections are made by the Human Services Instructors.

SBVC Creative Achievement Dance Award

Recipients must have excelled in dance classes, theater or concerts at SBVC. The Humanities Department selects the student.

Susan Shimoff Excellence in Child Development Scholarship

This scholarship is for students majoring in Child Development who have completed their requirements for the teaching certificate. The applicant must have a 3.5 grade point average, be committed to excellence and facing financial challenges. The Child Development Department selects the recipients.

Blythe Sprott Memorial

This scholarship is for students enrolled in the Alcohol Recovery Program who have completed 15 or more units with a 2.5 grade point average or higher. Instructors of the Alcohol Recovery classes will select the recipients.

Student Assistance Program Scholarship

Applicants must have worked in the SAP Office for at least 2 semesters. Applicants must have made significant contributions to the SAP program and must have a 3.0 or higher grade point average.

Abelardo Villarreal Memorial

Three scholarships are awarded annually to students who have a 2.0 grade point average and who have completed two courses in the SBVC ESL Program. Recipients are to be selected by the Villarreal Scholarship Committee.

Arbie Villarreal Memorial/English Department Scholarship

This scholarship was created to provide a source of revenue to students majoring in English and seeking to transfer to a 4-year university. The recipients must be sophomore /transfer students with a 3.0 grade point average.

Willie Charles Williams Memorial Scholarship

The student must have a 2.0 grade point average or higher and must be in the SBVC STAR Program. The scholarship promotes educational success by providing textbooks for disadvantaged students.

Wingate Air Conditioning Scholarship

HVAC second year students intending to transfer to a four-year college may apply. The Electronics Department selects the recipients.

General & Memorial Scholarships

Wayne R. Woolery Memorial

This scholarship is for students from the Applied Technology & Transportation Division who have completed 12 or more units with a 2.75 grade point average or higher. The Applied Technology & Transportation Division selects the students.

Section IV

The Scholarship & Honors Committee composed of a Dean, SBVC faculty and staff determines recipients of endowed scholarships for SBVC Students.

Sam & Frankie Andrews Memorial

This scholarship is for students returning to SBVC for a second year of study and who intend to earn a bachelor's degree.

Roger C. Anton Memorial

Applicants must have completed 60 units by the conclusion of the spring semester with a 3.0 or higher grade point average, must have completed the equivalent of three semesters of foreign language, and intend to enter the teaching profession.

Dr. Gordon C. Atkins Memorial

This scholarship is for students majoring in philosophy or religious studies (including pre-ministerial studies) that have completed a minimum of 24 transferable units with a 2.75 or higher grade point average.

Myrtle Bard Memorial

Applicants must have completed 12 or more units, must have a 2.0 or higher grade point average, and intend to return to SBVC in the fall.

Charles Beeman Memorial

This scholarship will be awarded to a transfer student with a junior standing. The student must have earned at least 24 units with a 3.0 grade point average and be pursuing a career in the health professions. Science and engineering majors may also be considered.

Felicie Bronner Memorial

Bronner scholarships are for students beginning their second year of study at SBVC. The award is based on academic achievement, community service, leadership, good citizenship and financial need.

Lois Carson Scholarship

Scholarships are awarded to African-American students who have completed a minimum of 60 units with a 3.0 or higher grade point average.

Milton P. Cheney Memorial

Applicants must have completed at least 12 units with a 2.5 grade point average and be preparing a career in social science.

General & Memorial Scholarships

Section IV, continued

Wilma Cochrane Scholarship

African-American students may apply. Completion of 12 units is required with a 2.0 grade point average. The student must have a student educational plan in one of the counseling programs on campus (General Counseling, EOPS, CARE, DSPS & STAR, CalWorks, etc.). Involvement in church activities is a plus (but not mandatory). Preference will be given to students who live on the west side of San Bernardino. *(The Scholarship Committee & Dr. Terry Maul will assist with the selection of the recipient.)*

Grayce & Harold Confer Memorial

Students who have financial need and have completed 12 or more units with a grade point average of 2.5 or higher may apply.

Dr. Gause Covington Memorial

This scholarship is for students in SBVC's Applied Technology & Transportation Division who will be seeking employment after completing their training at SBVC.

Nora Parker Coy Memorial

Preference is given to Latinas attending the evening college at SBVC.

Walter Douglas Memorial

Applicant must be re-entry students at SBVC in the Second Chance program who are returning to the college in the fall and have strong letters of recommendation. This student may also be juggling college, work, and family responsibilities and may not yet qualify for other scholarships. *(The SBVC Scholarship Committee and Mr. Douglas' daughter will assist with the selection.)*

Steven Ehrlich Architects Scholarship

The recipient is a student who wishes to pursue a degree in architecture.

Agnes & Eugene Farrar Memorial Scholarship

Two awards are given annually to students who have had to overcome a physical hardship in order to receive their college education.

Kevin T. Gustafson & Ruth Gustafson Buffum Memorial Scholarship

The Gustafson scholarship is awarded to students majoring in computer science. A 2.5 or higher grade point average is required. *(The SBVC Scholarship Committee and an individual designated by the donor will select these scholarships.)*

William S. Hellyer Memorial Scholarship

The Hellyer scholarships are awarded to students preparing for a career in law who have completed a minimum of 30 transferable units with a 3.5 grade point average or higher.

General & Memorial Scholarships

Section IV, continued

John Hile Memorial

This scholarship is for students who have completed 12 units or more with a grade point average of 2.0 or higher.

Edward “Duke” & Evelyn Hill Scholarship

Students majoring in business administration and planning a career in business may apply. Preference is given to applicants who have an interest in the field of real estate and who have served the college or community in some volunteer capacity. Applicants must have completed a minimum of 30 units with a 2.5 or higher grade point average.

Masako Hirata Scholarship

The recipient must be a Liberal Arts major who will transfer to a four-year college to earn a teaching certificate. Special consideration is given to students of Japanese descent.

Dr. Raymond Paul Hively Memorial

This scholarship is for students transferring to a four-year college with a minimum of 60 units, a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or higher and majoring in a health field (pre-med, dentistry, etc.).

Huntoon – Ferré Textbook Scholarship

Applicants must have completed 12 units. The scholarship is for the purchase of textbooks in the SBVC Bookstore.

Dorothy Inghram Scholarship

Available to incoming first year students and to returning SBVC students who attended Inghram Elementary School and maintain a 2.5 or higher grade point average in high school or at SBVC.

Bill Johnson Diesel Mechanic Scholarship

The scholarship from Johnson Machinery, Caterpillar Dealer will be awarded to students that are participating in the Diesel Program. The students must be in the second semester or beyond, be in good standing and have a minimum grade point average of 2.5 (All diesel students, light & heavy duty diesel are eligible).

The Kelly Family Technical Vocational Scholarship

The applicant's major must be in the technical field to complete a certificate program or an AA degree and he/she must be a returning student with a 2.0 grade point average or better.

General & Memorial Scholarships

Section IV, continued

Eva Mae & Philip Kennedy Memorial

The recipient must intend to transfer to a four-year institution in any major of study. A high grade point average is not required, and pre-requisite financial need may be considered.

Robert J. Keyes Memorial

Westside Republican scholarships are available for full-time students with a 2.75 grade point average or higher. Students must be interested in politics and submit evidence of interviews with the elected officials from the Republican or Democratic parties.

Thelma Knea Memorial

Business, Liberal Arts or Science majors may apply. The applicants must have completed 30 units with a minimum of a 3.0 grade point average.

George & Ada Lee Mattison Memorial

Awards are for students who have not previously been scholarship recipients.

Maureen Martinez Memorial

The student must have a 3.0 cumulative grade point average, must have applied for financial aid and may have any major.

J. W. McDaniel Memorial

Students who are majoring in psychology, philosophy, politics or sociology and who have completed 24 units with a 2.5 or higher grade point average are eligible for this scholarship.

Jerry Morrison Memorial

The Morrison scholarships are for students committed to earn at least an Associate Degree and who maintain a minimum of a 2.5 grade point average or higher, who are employed, self supporting students, and preferably married.

Charles Obershaw Automotive Scholarship

The student must have a 2.0 grade point average or higher and be enrolled and pursuing a degree in any of SBVC's Automotive Department programs.

Osher Initiative for California Community College Students

Funded by the Bernard Osher Foundation, this scholarship is for students who have completed 24 units of degree-applicable study at the time of scholarship receipt, are enrolled in six units for the ensuring semester, and qualify for a Board of Governor's fee waiver.

Leonor Pimental Memorial

This scholarship is for a Latina, re-entry student.

General & Memorial Scholarships

Section IV, continued

James Rankin Memorial Scholarship

Applicants must have completed a minimum of 12 units with a grade point average of 2.5 or higher.

Louise M. Rodgers Merit Fund

Two scholarships will be awarded to students who have been at SBVC for one semester or more. Preference is given to students who graduated from Arroyo Valley High School, Cajon High School, Pacific High School, San Andreas High School, San Bernardino High School, San Geronio High School, Sierra High School or the SBCUSD Middle College High School. Applicants must maintain a grade point average of 3.0 or higher.

San Bernardino Valley College Faculty & Staff Association

Applicants must have completed a minimum of 25 units by the end of the spring semester with a 2.75 or higher grade point average and be returning to SBVC for the fall semester.

SBVC Foundation Memorial Scholarships

Applicants must have completed a minimum of 30 units by the spring semester with a 3.0 grade point average or higher and be returning to SBVC in the fall. Scholarships are given in memory of SBVC Alumni, faculty, staff and students.

Cleo & Rollie Schmidt Memorial

Applicants must have completed at least 25 units at SBVC with a 2.75 or higher grade point average and be actively engaged in creative writing. Schmidt memorial scholarships are awarded annually to students who show promise in creative writing and/or to students in sales. *(Recipients are to be selected by the SBVC Scholarship Committee with counsel from faculty involved in the creative writing program.)*

Schnarre Scholarship

The George Schnarre scholarship will assist students majoring in the field of business who demonstrate a need for assistance to further their education. Students majoring in business with a 3.00 grade point average and that have completed or enrolled in real estate classes should be considered first followed by other business majors.

Schools First Scholarship

This scholarship is for students in need of assistance with textbooks. Applicants must be full-time students with a 2.5 or higher grade point average. Scholarships are awarded to students in any major of study who demonstrate financial need.

Dr. Juanita H. Scott

The recipient must have completed a minimum of 24 units at SBVC with a grade point average of 2.5 or higher. She may be a student in any major area of study. The award is for a female, single parent, head of household.

General & Memorial Scholarships

Section IV, continued

Dr. Anne Shirrells Memorial

This scholarship is for African-American students with financial need and who show promise of academic achievement and an interest in a career in community services.

Mary Shook Memorial

Applicants must be continuing or returning students majoring in office information systems. Preference will be given to those who are employed and enrolled on a part-time basis.

Dr. Donald L. Singer Scholarship

The student selected must have completed his first year at SBVC and be returning for his second year. He/She must maintain an overall 3.0 grade point average, be involved in school activities (ASB, inter-collegiate athletics or campus-wide committees) and community service activities (political campaign, community service agency, in service to young people, or public school program).

Laurie Smits Staude Scholarship

The applicant must be a female single parent who has custody of a minor child or children. She must have completed 30 transferable units with a cumulative 3.0 or better grade point average. *(The SBVC Scholarship Committee and an individual designated by the donor will select the recipient.)*

Aram M. Sogomonian Memorial

The candidate may be a male or female transfer student majoring in Political Science, Spanish, Law or Chemistry with a 3.0 or better grade point average. *(The donor and the SBVC Scholarship Committee select the recipient.)*

Julie Sommars Scholarship

Applicants for this scholarship must be active in one or more areas of the arts.

Charles Terrell Scholarship

The recipient must hold a grade point average of 2.75 and have a goal of transferring to a four-year institution to earn a teaching credential.

Valles Family Scholarship

Applicants must have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher and be preparing for a career in teaching.

Donna Watkins Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to a student with a Liberal Arts Major who has completed 12 or more units at SBVC with a 2.5 or higher grade point average.

Daniel Jin Wong Memorial

Applicants must be enrolled in SBVC courses preparing them to transfer to a four-year college or university program in engineering. Native-American or Chinese ancestry is required. This scholarship provides all expenses to enroll at SBVC including a monthly stipend.

Evelyn Wilcox Scholarship

The Wilcox Scholarship is for a first year student majoring in business or preparing for a career in any business field.

James Yurkunski Memorial

Applicants must be returning students with a 2.5 grade point average or higher who intend to teach. They must have completed at least two semesters of a foreign language at SBVC or two years of foreign language in high school.

Nick & Christina Zaharopoulos

Recipients must have financial need, low or poverty-level family income, U. S. citizenship or application pending.

Scholarship & Awards by Nomination Only

Section V

Students do not apply for these scholarships. Students are nominated by the Division, Department or Association listed on the scholarship descriptions.

Communications Scholarships

• Bob Nichol Memorial

Students majoring in telecommunications engineering are selected for the Nichol Scholarship. Recipients are selected by the Telecommunications Department.

• Television Production Certificate Program Scholarship

This scholarship is for a student enrolled in the Television Production Certificate Program that has completed at least 15 units in the Certificate Program, but has at least one course remaining to complete the certificate. The student must have a grade point average of 2.8 or higher in the program to be eligible. The scholarship is to be used for Communications course tuition the semester following the one in which it is awarded. The Communications/Broadcasting Department selects the recipient.

Distribution Management Association Endowed Logistics Scholarship

Students majoring in Warehouse/Logistics/Transportation who will complete a certificate program or an AA degree may apply. A 2.0 or better grade point average and a one page letter stating career objectives in industry is a requirement.

Dr. Raymond F. Ellerman Scholarship

Recipients will be continuing students active in a performing group and/or in music and must have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher. The Choir Director will determine the recipients.

Dr. Arthur M. Jensen President's Award

An annual award is made to a student who has combined academic excellence with notable service to the college. Students are nominated by the faculty and selected by the SBVC Scholarship Committee. The faculty will receive a nomination form from the Scholarship Office.

Effie Jane & John Lounsbury Memorial

Candidates must have completed 60 units of college work by the end of the spring semester, taken an active role in campus leadership, and achieved significant success in their studies. Students must have a 2.0 or higher grade point average. Students are nominated by SBVC managers, faculty and counselors and are selected by the SBVC Scholarship Committee. The Scholarship Office distributes the nomination forms to the faculty.

MEChA

Recipients should be active members of the MEChA organization who have completed 12 or more units with a 2.0 grade point average or higher and hold a current membership card. The MEChA advisor selects the recipients.

Gordon L. Novinger Memorial Life Science Scholarship

A student returning to SBVC and who has a 3.0 or higher grade point average with a minimum of 24 units will be selected. The Biology Department Committee will select the recipient.

Susan Petta Memorial Scholarship

A student athlete with a 2.5 grade point average or higher, who will continue his/her education at a senior college, may be nominated. The Athletic Department nominates and selects the recipient.

Rothhaar Family Scholarship

The faculty of the Speech Department will nominate students. Academic excellence (G.P.A. of 3.5 or higher) is required as well as (evidence) of public excellence and college and community service. The student must have completed at least 24 transferable units (including at least one transfer level speech course in which the student received a grade of "A"). The SBVC Speech Department faculty will serve as the judges of this award.

SBVC Biology Department Scholarship

An annual award will be given to an outstanding biology student selected by the Biology Scholarship Committee.

San Bernardino Valley College, Honors Program

The Honors Scholarship is awarded to a student who is a member of the Honors Program. The student must have served on the Honors Program Student Committee, completed 2 or more honors classes and completed 3 out of 4 public service points. The Honors Program Advisors select the students.

Sigma Delta Mu, Alfa de California Chapter

The Spanish faculty from the membership of Sigma Delta Mu selects awardees. Eligible students for nomination must have a minimum of one class in Spanish in residence; a 4.00 grade point average in Spanish; 3.0 or better grade point average overall and unanimous approval by the Spanish faculty.

San Bernardino Valley Independent Insurance Agents Association Humanities Division Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to students majoring in the humanities. The recipients must have completed 24 or more units with a 3.5 or higher grade point average and be returning to the college to complete his sophomore year. The students are nominated and selected by the Humanities Division.

Social Science Division Scholarship

The students must have a 3.5 or better grade point average. They must have completed 24 or more units at SBVC by the end of the spring semester, must major in Administration of Justice or Anthropology, History, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology Religious Studies, Sociology or General Social Science, and must be returning to the college to complete their sophomore year. The Social Science Division makes this selection.

Mike Todd Memorial

This scholarship is awarded each year to a sophomore baseball student-athlete to assist him furthering his education at a senior college or university. The Athletic Department handles the selection.

English Department/J. Hal Walters Memorial

Candidates must have completed a minimum of 12 units with a 3.0 grade point average. They must be English majors and must demonstrate noteworthy performance in language, literary perception, and/or creative writing. A member of the English Department must nominate students.

Art Department Scholarships

Section VI

Students do not apply for these scholarships; the faculty selects them. Each recipient is selected by unanimous agreement of the faculty in the Art Department.

Tom Akin Memorial Scholarship Awards

Four scholarships are awarded for artistic excellence.

David Lawrence Scholarship

The recipient should be a student who shows great creative promise in any area of the Arts.

Beryl Larkin Art Award

The selected art student should reflect some or all of the following: A watercolorist, with unique, creative, innovative style.

John & Margaret Lawson Awards

Two awards are made: one for excellence in sculpture and one for excellence in painting.

San Bernardino Art Association Cash Award

This award is made for excellence in art. The Art Association judges make selections.

San Bernardino Valley College Art Club Best All Around Student

These awards are made for best work and for best art student.

San Bernardino Valley College Art Cash Award

Awards are given for painting, drawing, life drawing, photography, filmmaking, ceramics, glassblowing, art history, sculpture, commercial art, printmaking, lettering and design.

San Bernardino Valley College Foundation Purchase Award

A maximum of two art works is purchased subject to approval of the SBVC Foundation Board of Directors.

Health Science Scholarships

Section VII

These scholarships are available for students enrolled in one of the professional programs offered through the Division of Health Science. **Students must apply through the Division of Health Science.**

Librada Sosa Cave Memorial

Scholarships are awarded to students enrolled in the nursing program who have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher. The scholarship committee of Everett-Hunter Department of Nursing selects the recipients.

Colton Woman's Club

The candidate must be a woman in the Nursing Program, preferably a Colton High School graduate or resident of Colton.

Linda Ewing Memorial

Students in the R. N. program may apply.

Kenneth & Pauline Hunter Memorial Scholarship

Students are eligible to apply for this award if they are accepted into the Everett-Hunter Department of Nursing and have completed the majority of their prerequisites at SBVC.

Arlene Johnson Scholarship

Applicants must be nursing students.

Leonard Family Scholarship

Qualified students must be majoring in Nursing at SBVC, maintain a minimum 3.0 grade point average and have declared financial need.

Donald D. McCawley Memorial

Applicants must have completed the pre-nursing program at SBVC and be accepted into the Registered Nurses program at the college. The scholarship of the Everett-Hunter Department of Nursing selects the recipients.

Mended Hearts Nursing Scholarship, Inland Chapter #123

This scholarship is for students entering the Cardiovascular-nursing field who have achieved a 3.00 grade point average or better and are familiar with the Mended Hearts, Inc.

Top Ten Scholarship Tips

Ever wonder what the people who award the scholarships want to see? Here are a few tips for our SBVC students.

Tip 1: Give concrete examples. If your answer to an essay question is abstract, support it with a concrete example that illustrates your point. The scholarship sponsor wants to see evidence that you satisfy their criteria, not just unsupported statements.

Tip 2: Apply only if you are eligible. Read all the scholarship requirements and directions carefully, and make sure that you are eligible before you send in your application. Your application will not be considered if you are not qualified to apply.

Tip 3: Identify the sponsor's goals. Try to understand the sponsor's motivation in offering the award. Do they want to promote interest in their field? Do they want to identify promising future researchers and business leaders? If you can identify their goals, you can direct your application toward satisfying those goals, increasing your chances of winning the award.

Tip 4: Complete the application in full and follow directions. Many students fail to follow directions. You can give yourself a competitive advantage by reading the directions carefully. Provide everything that is required. But do not supply things that are not requested. You will not impress and you might be disqualified. Be sure to complete the entire application. If a question does not apply, note that on the application. Do not just leave it blank.

Tip 5: Neatness counts. Write your application information in a word program before filling in the online form. Copy it to a CD or flash drive so you can cut and paste the text into the application. Proofread the entire application carefully. Nothing is less impressive than an application with misspelled words or grammar errors.

Tip 6: Write an accomplishments resume. Compile a list of all your accomplishments. This will help you identify your strengths and prepare a better application. Give a copy of the resume to the people who are writing letters of recommendation for you. They will be able to work some of the tidbits into their letters, making it seem like they know you better.

Tip 7: Watch all deadlines. Impose a deadline for yourself that is at least two weeks before the stated deadline. Use this 'buffer time' to proofread your application before you send it off. YOU are responsible for making sure all parts of the application arrive on time. This includes supporting materials, such as letters of recommendation and transcripts. So make sure everyone who is contributing to your application has ample lead-time.

Tip 8: Take steps to make sure your application gets where it needs to go. Before sending the application, make a copy of the entire packet and keep it on file. If your application goes astray, you can always reproduce it quickly.

Tip 9: Ask for help if you need it. If you have problems with the application, do not hesitate to contact the SBVC Writing Center. The center is located in Room 201 of the Liberal Arts Building and will provide free assistance to you with your scholarship application. But do not expect anyone to do the work for you. Completing the application is your job.

Tip 10: Remember - your scholarship application represents YOU! Your ability to submit a neat, timely, complete application reflects on you. It is the face you present to the sponsoring organization. Take pride in yourself by submitting the best application you can.
