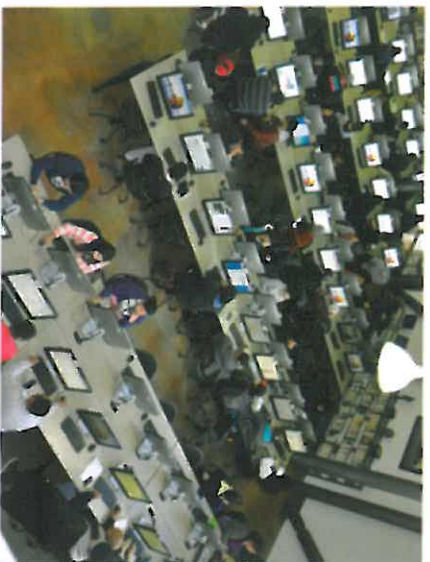

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APPLY FOR ADMISSION

Step #1

- Go to www.valleycollege.edu and click on "Apply For Admission" at top of page
- Click on "New Students" (links to CCC Apply)
- Read all info and click on "Begin Application for San Bernardino Valley College"
- Once submitted, students will receive a student I.D. and user name via email within 72 hours (retrieve student I.D. at www.valleycollege.edu/whatsmyid if email is not received)
- Print health card (if under 18 when term begins), fill out and return it to Admissions (AD/SS-100)

ONLINE ORIENTATION

Step #2

- Follow login instructions at www.valleycollege.edu/webadvisor
- Click on "Current Students" icon
- Under the category "SBVC Other Services", click on "Online Orientation"
- Completing orientation should take between 30 - 45 minutes
- Once completed, print online orientation completion certificate form (students will need this to proceed to next step of Assessment)

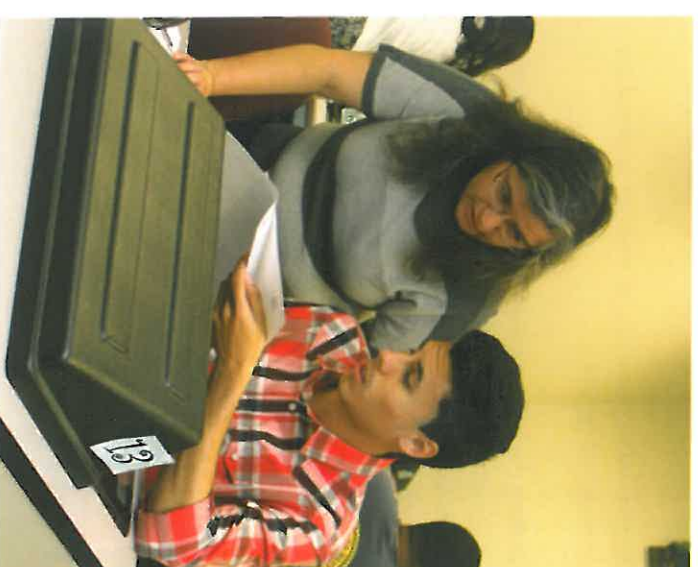
PREPARING FOR THE ASSESSMENT TEST

Step #3

Preparing in advance for the Assessment test is one of the most important predictors of success at San Bernardino Valley College. Simply put, the higher a student scores on the Assessment, the greater chance they have at succeeding in college and transferring to a four-year institution.

Did You Know?

- Engineering Education reported that 500 engineering leaders ranked communication skills (including speaking) to be more important than technical skills.
- Michigan State University conducted a study of personnel directors from major companies, government agencies, and nonprofit organizations asking them to list the top ten most desired skills in new recruits: Oral and Written skills were ranked first and second, respectively whereas technical job skills ranked seventh.
- A 20 year study of MBA graduates from Stanford University concluded that no skill is more important to a successful career in business than good communication (especially the ability to persuade.)
