


Institutional Learning Outcomes

A BRIEF HISTORY OF ILOS AT SBVC

- Once called Core Competencies
 - Language is now "Institutional Learning Outcomes" (ILOs)
 - Approved in 2016
 - Developed when we approached SAOs, PLOs, or SLOs differently
 - Focus was more on instructional areas
- Now, we are reviewing all outcomes more regularly
 - Rubrics
 - Updated more often
 - Looking at data

WHAT ARE ILOS NOW?

- Skills, knowledge, or abilities we want students to be able to demonstrate once they graduate or transfer from SBVC.
 - Upon graduation or transfer from SBVC, students will be able to:
- A holistic approach to educating our students:
 - We work together as student services and instructional areas.
 - Areas may see themselves in some ILOs, but it's not necessary to align with all five ILOs.



INTENT IN UPDATING ILOS

- Align with ACCJC standards.
- Start a regular review cycle for ILOs.
- Focus on skills and abilities students should be able to demonstrate once they graduate or transfer.
- Be inclusive of all groups:
 - CTE
 - Student Services and SAO programs
- Incorporate DEIA work.
- Same general rubric and structure as PLOs, SLOs, and SAOs.

PROPOSED ILOS

 Communication Skills: Comprehend content and communicate in written, spoken, signed, or artistic formats.
Quantitative Reasoning Skills: Apply mathematical or analytical skills to identify and solve problems and synthesize and evaluate ideas.

- 3. Critical Thinking Skills and Information Literacy: Critically evaluate qualitative and quantitative hypotheses, sources, and conclusions.
- 4. Personal, Academic, and Career Responsibilities: Develop goals for personal, academic, and career environments.
- 5. Social and Global Awareness: Recognize the impact of one's actions on the environment and one's role in society with respect to diversity, equity, inclusion, and anti-racism.
