Proposed AB 928 ad hoc and steering committees

Purpose: To explore the local implications of AB 928 at SBVC. AB 928 impacts the current transfer GE patterns by streamlining them to a single transfer pathway, named the CalGETC. The Curriculum Committee proposes an ad hoc committee and a steering committee that will explore the best options for SBVC to adapt its local GE pattern for students who do not plan to transfer. We want to explore the following questions, among many others:

- Does our current pathway need to be redefined to better align with CalGETC?
- Do we need more than one GE pattern at SBVC (e.g. should we have a separate pathway for CTE students)?
- What are the implications on our students?
- How many students graduate with an AA or AS, then decide they want to transfer?

Length of the committees: Statewide decisions related to AB 928 will be in place by the end of spring 2024. Both the ad hoc and steering committees aim to terminate at the end of spring 2024, unless state deadlines are extended or local decisions are incomplete. If this is the case, we will return to the Academic Senate.
