Greetings, esteemed Trustees,

The faculty of SBVC returned to campus a few weeks ago. Our theme this year is *Taking Flight*, and we are doing just that, taking flight. There is excitement in seeing student faces in our classrooms, experiencing full class sections, and readying our selves for the flight we are taking this year. The Academic Senate hopes to bring many positive reports on developments, projects, and achievements that align with the District and our own Mission, Values, and Goals. We will be sure to keep you apprised of opportunities for growth and development as well. We invite you to join us in this journey.

Information to Inform Policy

The Academic Senate and faculty body want to recognize the work the District has done and the support by the Board of Trustees to provide Books+ to our students. We were pleased to be able to share with our students the continuance of this offering through the Spring 2024 semester. The impact of Books+ on student access is undeniable as this program has literally obliterated one of the largest barriers for our students. We recognize this program is costly and likely not sustainable. We also know that the removal of cost for textbooks to our students has also lined the already flush pockets of the publishers, who are responsible for the barrier to students in the first place. The conversations among faculty surround the question of what we do when Books+ comes to an end, because we know there is an end. The answer is in the continuance, ongoing development, and growth of our ZTC Degree Pathways and OER materials.

The faculty of SBVC have been committed to the offering of Open Education Resources for many years with efforts being supported by the faculty body, faculty buy in, and the award of an OER grant in 2016 per the stipulations of the College Textbook Affordability Act of 2015. The campus has continued to champion the need for continued OER offerings. Funding is always a factor in long term institutionalization and forward movement with growth and development. While we, as a campus, have been able to sustain the work initiated and completed under the support of the initial OER and ZTC Grants received. we have faced a few challenges that have limited our ability to realize significant growth.

As you may know, the state has demonstrated their commitment to ZTC and OER and expectations of expansion and growth of such offerings as evidenced by the distribution of a \$20,000.00 planning grant, the distribution of \$180,000.00 for planning, and an opportunity to apply for additional funding for acceleration of the selected project.

San Bernardino Valley College Academic Senate and has convened a work group, inclusive of the faculty who were instrumental in the initial ZTC/OER work under the original grants, to create a plan and proposal to take to the present to present to the collegial consultation bodies. This work will continue to be faculty let and student centers.

By now, you may be asking how this impacts policy. The Board and District has practiced the policy of funding Books+ over the past two academic years. While the benefits to students has been significant, we need to continue to support the growth and development of ZTC/OER resources and programs by way of establishing and supporting policies related to this work. ZTC/OER resources are the most sustainable method for removing the barrier of textbook cost for our students. We look forward to providing updates to you over this academic year and to your ongoing support for this work.
