Both campuses are meeting along with the district to look at how to continue to utilize dual enrollment as a way to remove barriers for our students and from an equity perspective. If you don't know, dual enrollment is in the spotlight right now from the Governor's office to the Chancellor's office, as well as the State Academic Senate. It is on our radar with our mission and Educational Master Plan. It is being highlighted as a strong method to create equity, access, and success for our students. That's been part of our work with enrollment to maintain the status of our campus as a middle-sized college.
