Current Accountability

• Title 5, Section 55200:

"Accessible" means a person with a disability is afforded the opportunity to acquire the same information, engage in the same interactions, and enjoy the same services as a person without a disability in an equally effective and equally integrated manner, with substantially equivalent ease of use.

Integral part of DE training since 2020.



The New Law

- April 2024: New rule under Title II of the ADA.
- All digital content provided by public institutions must meet Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.1 Level AA.
- Compliance date: April 24, 2026.





Who's Affected?

- Everyone (not just faculty).
- All Canvas users.
- Anyone who posts anything online.
- Anyone who sends digital content.



If you make digital content available to other people or the public, you're included.



What does this mean?

Everything we post online must be accessible to anyone who wants or needs to access it.

- Not a disability accommodation.
- Disclosure is not required.
- Request is not necessary.
- It's not just law...it's equity.



What content?

Everything we post online must be accessible to anyone who wants or needs to access it.



- Canvas pages Website pages




- Videos we create

Checking in



Archived content

If content meets all four criteria for archived content, it may be exempt:

- 1. Created before the compliance deadline (April 24, 2026).
- Retained only for reference, research, or recordkeeping—not for active use in current programs or services.
- Stored in a clearly labeled, dedicated archive area of your website or platform.
- 4. Not altered or updated after being archived.



Archived content

What this means for faculty:

- Committee chairs: Agendas, minutes, documents
- Faculty chairs, leads, club advisors: Past events flyers, documents
- Instructors: Past Canvas shells (currently not labeled "Archive")

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eBooks and OER

Publisher is required to make content accessible; Accessibility Conformance Report (ACR).

- Working on campus process for eBooks.
 - Standard books likely OK with accessible eBook readers.
 - Textbooks or more complex digital resources need ACR verification.
- OER Sites should have ACR posted.
 - LibreTexts and OpenStax seem OK.
 - Other OER would need confirmation.



It should not be faculty or faculty chair work to verify ACR for eBooks.



Training and Support

- WebAIM Accessibility Course (QR Code)





