    - ➤ G. Contreras shared that it had been an exciting day on campus, with a pep rally and the First-Gen conference bringing energy and engagement to the college community. He thanked everyone for contributing to a successful fall semester. He reported that the College Council unanimously supported the Veterans Resource Center's request to remain in its current location, citing strong rationale from the center; this recommendation will be discussed with Cabinet next week. Although the



new student services building is designed to include them, space concerns remain, and Contreras emphasized honoring veterans' preferences. He also noted that Sheri Lillard provided a solid update on accessibility compliance, acknowledging that significant follow-up work is necessary and that support will be offered to ensure progress. Turning to athletics, he highlighted that the final home football game is this Saturday at 6 PM, with a strong community turnout expected. After last year's canceled season, the team has demonstrated remarkable resilience, overcoming major challenges including reviving a teammate on the field and supporting a player battling cancer. Trainers and medical staff from Loma Linda Hospital will be recognized at an upcoming board meeting and again in the spring. Contreras added that reorganization updates will be shared on November 12 and expressed appreciation for everyone's efforts throughout the semester, concluding with the announcement that next Tuesday will be a day off.

structural changes as well as questions about committee functions, membership, and how the committees will connect. Some respondents urged balancing the college's focus on enrollment with attention to educational quality. A key concern involved splitting program review, with fears that separating instructional review from other areas could reinforce silos; faculty currently review across areas, and some student services units have not participated in the Aspire process.

#### > Dual Enrollment

■ The group discussed the proposed dual enrollment faculty lead position, inviting further faculty input on the job description and specific needs of the role. Faculty emphasized the importance of clearly defining logistical responsibilities, especially in disciplines like the sciences that require coordination of materials, storage, technology access, and campus-specific equipment such as microscopes. They also highlighted the need for clarity around coordinating room access, navigating various school scheduling systems, managing classroom behavior alongside campus liaisons, and ensuring knowledge of FERPA due to frequent interactions with parents. Participants agreed that while the director should manage broader logistical operations, the faculty lead is essential for providing a faculty-centered perspective, identifying gaps, and communicating needs across instructional areas. made for data on the number and types of dual enrollment courses and the high schools involved to better understand program scope. The position, which carries a full reassignment load, is intended to help faculty define which courses at each grade level are appropriate, assess department capacity, and ensure dual enrollment agreements reflect faculty standards of instruction. The discussion concluded with a reminder for faculty to reflect on the role and provide additional feedback as the college works toward a more cohesive dual enrollment structure.

#### > Student Life

The group reviewed the proposed 0.5 faculty reassignment for Student Life and Leadership, emphasizing the college's commitment to building a more vibrant, engaging campus environment for students. The position is intended to give faculty a stronger role in mentoring students, supporting student organizations and activities, and helping strengthen student engagement beyond the classroom. Participants noted that this reassignment offers faculty the opportunity to work closely with students and guide them in ways that complement administrative support. Faculty were encouraged to provide feedback on the job description so that the faculty voice is reflected in shaping the role and ensuring it effectively supports student needs. Feedback will be collected by Andrea as the college continues refining the position.

  - b) Voting Process, Jeremiah Gilbert (10 minutes)
  - **❖** NOTES
    - > J. Gilbert explained that he is overseeing the Academic Senate presidential election after Tatiana, the Elections Committee Chair, recused herself due to being a candidate; he noted it is common for former presidents to manage the process. He apologized for missing the previous meeting and addressed questions that had surfaced. First, he clarified that although a written statement from candidates is not in the bylaws, it has been a customary practice since 2015, carried forward by previous election chairs. Second, he confirmed that the requirement for voting faculty to hold at least a 50% load is explicitly stated in the bylaws, though this language can be amended in the future through the proposed revisions currently under review. J. Gilbert reported that three individuals were nominated, two accepted, Thomas Berry and Tatiana Vasquez, and therefore no preliminary vote is needed to narrow the field. The committee has prepared a mock ballot and aims to release the official ballot with candidate statements by Friday, pending confirmation from Research. Voting will run until December 1, with results announced at the December 3 meeting. He reminded members that the president-elect receives 20% reassigned time in the spring to shadow the current president. J. Gilbert concluded by inviting questions before allowing each candidate to speak for five minutes.

  - ➤ Thomas Berry (summary)
    - T. Berry introduced himself as a committed community college professor who believes deeply in the transformative power of faculty leadership and the central role of the Academic Senate. He described the Senate President's responsibility as twofold: serving faculty by convening, representing, and uniting them in shared governance, and serving students by supporting the faculty who shape their academic experience. T. Berry highlighted the leadership lessons he has gained from past presidents and fellow senators, lessons in courage, humility, advocacy, equity, student-centeredness, boundary-setting, and bridge-building. He emphasized that his leadership approach is grounded in experience, collaboration, fairness, and strong knowledge of governance processes and parliamentary procedure. Berry noted his long journey from 18 years as an adjunct to becoming full-time faculty and his extensive service record, including roles as senator, Academic Senate secretary, curriculum chair, outcomes lead, and OER lead. He concluded by expressing gratitude for the nomination and his desire to be a president who amplifies faculty voices and strengthens collective impact.

problem-solving. She stated that effective governance relies on collective wisdom and on centering faculty and student equity in everyday work. T. Vasquez highlighted her commitment to clarifying and strengthening academic policies and procedures so all faculty can confidently and actively participate in shared governance. She emphasized that leadership is not individual but collective, grounded in mentorship and succession planning to ensure the Senate's long-term stability and effectiveness. Drawing on nearly a decade of service, including roles as science division senator, department chair, co-chair of Facilities and Safety, current Academic Senate Vice President, and co-chair of the Participatory Governance Task Force, she underscored her experience advancing equity, faculty empowerment, and institutional improvement. T. Vasquez also noted her engagement in statewide Academic Senate work and her belief that strengthening partnerships with ASCCC, FACCC, the Community College League, and the faculty union is essential for navigating both internal governance changes and external legislative pressures. With 16 years of institutional knowledge, she committed to inclusive leadership that centers academic and professional matters and to working collectively for the success of programs, students, and the college community. 7) Floor Items - Reserved to raise concerns within the Academic Senate scope.
