	Program Review Committee (PRC) Focus Areas (10+1): Coordination and oversight of the college's cyclical Program Review/ASPIRE, ensuring the process is driven by data-based decision making and aligned with institutional mission; and establishing, reviewing, and recommending changes to the faculty hiring prioritization process. houghts? □ □
	Professional Development Committee (PDC) Focus Areas (10+1): Professional development (flex) policies, faculty training, and instructional and non-instructional improvement initiatives and coordination with the college's professional development budget allocation. houghts?
	Honors Committee (HC) Focus Areas (10+1): Oversee and develop policies and best-practices specific to honors curriculum development, academic standards for honors distinction and program completion, and transfer requirements for honors programs. houghts? □
	Distance Education (DE) Focus Areas (10+1): Coordination and oversight of Distance Education policy, best-practices, quality review standards (e.g., Accessibility Rubric compliance), technology integration for instruction, and DE faculty training requirements. houghts? □
