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The Academic Senate at SBVC is dedicated to empowering and strengthening the voices of our esteemed faculty members. We are committed to fostering active participation, while maintaining a positive and respectful atmosphere that ensures our perspectives resonate strongly throughout our institution. We are the official voice in accordance with, Title 5, section 53200, of the California Education Code §70902 (b)(7) “...the governing board of each community college district shall... ensure the right of academic senates to assume primary responsibility for making recommendations in the areas of curriculum and academic standards,” which is known as 10+1.

1) Call to Order a) Call to Order/Establish Quorum b) Approval of Agenda	Meeting called to order at 3:07 pm. Motion to approve the agenda with addition of Academic Renewal to new business. 1st: A. Mills 2nd: M. Notarangelo (teller report attached) Motion passes.
2) Public Comments a) General Public Comments - refers to the opportunity for members of the public to speak on both agenda and non-agenda items. <i>(Reserved for Guests only and limited to 10 minute total time limit, 3 minute max per person)</i> ● Yvette Lee - addressed the Senate to provide context on the Program Review Committee's move away from ranking resource requests. She noted that two new committees are being formed – a Planning and Resource Allocation Committee and a new Institutional Effectiveness Committee – and that roles between these bodies and Program Review are still being worked out. She explained the committee's concerns with ranking: reviewers are not subject-matter experts in every program, only a small number of readers	



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evaluate each program's request, and requests are often ranked based on how well they are written rather than actual need. She noted that for the past two years the committee has instead forwarded division-level rankings to College Council. She also raised concern that ranking fosters unhealthy competition between programs rather than the collaborative, reflective purpose the committee is meant to serve, and reiterated that Program Review's core charge is program quality, reflection, and growth – not the allocation of funding.

4) Reports a) AS President, Andrea Hecht ❖ NOTES ➤ President Hecht delivered her final report as outgoing Academic Senate President. She thanked senators for their support, hard work, and commitment throughout the year, and thanked President Gil Contreras for his mentorship during her term. She announced that two positions – an OER/ZTC position and the Chair of Chairs position – would	



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be posted this week, and encouraged senators to share the postings with colleagues. She closed by presenting each senator with a keepsake (a miniature 3D-printed Blue) commemorating the year.

b) Academic Senate Subcommittees

i) Elections

❖ NOTES

- T. Vasquez presented the subcommittee's annual report. The subcommittee brought two recommendations forward to the Senate this year; several other goals remain outstanding and will be carried into next year, including work on updating the Senate bylaws. She also reported that the Faculty Leads, Curriculum and Distance Education faculty position has been filled, but the Faculty Learning and Innovation Coordinator position remains vacant with no letters of interest received; Senate leadership will discuss next steps.

c) Academic Senate Taskforce

i) Artificial Intelligence Task Force, Jessy Lemieux

ii) AB1705, Task Force

❖ NOTES

- The AB 1705 Task Force reported that the task force, which supports AB 1705 implementation across English, math, science, and counseling, is sunseting in Spring 2026. Transfer-level completion has improved under AB 1705, but equity gaps remain, particularly in STEM and calculus pathways. The task force



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developed proposals for a Summer Bridge program and Community of Practice initiatives; a Summer Bridge could not be scheduled this summer, so a possible Winter Bridge (between fall 2026 and spring 2027) is being explored instead. The task force also helped develop an AB 1705 data dashboard with Institutional Research for comparing outcomes across disciplines and courses. Recommendations and next steps include expanding student support (embedded tutoring, supplemental instruction, learning communities), funding Summer/Winter Bridge programs, dedicating time during Fall 2026 convocation week for data and support discussions, and continuing cross-campus collaboration. SBVC was selected to participate in the statewide Math Equity in Action (MEIA) Academy for 2026–27, with three convenings (May, November, and April 2027) and 10 SBVC faculty/management participants across math, science, and counseling. A final written report is due by May 16, 2026 and will be posted on the Academic Senate website.

d) Committees

i) Distance Education, Sheri Lillard

❖ NOTES

- S. Lillard provided a summary of the committee's work this year. The committee created two new DE agenda templates – a standard version and an emergency version – so all courses are prepared to move online if needed, and established the college's Regular and Substantive Interaction (RSI) policy defining qualifying weekly activities. It also updated the committee's structure to align with the Senate's standardized committee-structure format



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and provided feedback on the RSI training model. This academic year included 5 DE Level 1 course offerings, 1 refresher, and 8 RSI training sessions (5 more scheduled); 156 faculty recertified for DE, just over 50 were newly certified for DE Level 1, and close to 300 faculty registered for RSI training (roughly 200 still to complete it). Upcoming offerings include a DE refresher on May 18 (synchronous format) and two summer DE Level 1 sessions to be co-facilitated by Maria Notarangelo and Lisa Henkel. The committee also discussed converting the refresher training to a fully asynchronous format; it agreed this is the right direction but ran out of time this semester, and will continue that work in fall. Senate thanked Sherri Lillard, who is retiring, for her extensive work and years of service on the committee.

e) President, Gil Contreras

❖ NOTES

➤ President Contreras thanked the Senate for an “epic, historic year” and thanked senators for attending student recognition ceremonies alongside the President's Cabinet. He announced the retiree reception this Friday at 1:00 pm in B1-100, and noted that a Commencement timeline for faculty would be distributed by email. He thanked outgoing Senate President Andrea Hecht for her collaborative partnership over the year, noting that the Senate–Cabinet relationship, while not always in full agreement, has strengthened the college through reorganization, new committee structures, and greater transparency. He closed by looking forward to Commencement.



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5) Unfinished Business a) Education Policy and Procedures Committee, Judy Joshua (10 min) ❖ NOTES ➤ None b) SBVC AI Use Framework and Best Practices v1.0, Second Read, AI Task Force, Jessy Lemieux (5 min) ❖ NOTES ➤ The AI Task Force presented its second read of the SBVC AI Use Framework, developed over roughly two months by a cross-divisional committee, informed by statewide frameworks, practices at other community colleges, survey data, and AP 3775. A question was raised about the timeline for public access to the framework materials (including badge graphics); the presenter indicated these would be posted to the AI Task Force website within the week of approval. A question was also raised about the task force's continuation timeline (referencing Recommendation #4), and a friendly amendment was accepted to extend the task force's continuation through Spring 2027. c) Policy personnel language bylaws, 2nd read, Jamie Salyer (5 min) ❖ NOTES ➤ J. Salyer presented the second read of proposed bylaw changes for the Personnel Policy Subcommittee: renaming the body from “committee” to “subcommittee” consistent with a new standing rules document; cleanup of duplicate/inconsistent date references; alignment of review cycles to a two-year cycle; and addition of a reference to supplemental information found in the standing rules. d) Program Review Committee Details, 2nd Read, Tatiana Vasquez (5 min)	Motion to approve the recommendations for the AI 2nd read and keep the task for until spring 2027. 1st: A. - T. Vasquez noted that the version of the Program Review Committee details previously posted to the website was an incomplete working draft (meeting notes), not the committee's final proposed version, and asked Bethany. Tasaka and D. Graham to present the correct, committee-approved version.
- B. Tasaka (Program Review Committee) presented the committee-approved structure, which differs from the Senate Executive's version primarily in that it does not include an administrative co-chair (only a non-voting management resource member).
- Discussion followed regarding two distinct questions embedded in the two competing proposals: (1) whether Program Review should continue to rank resource requests, and (2) whether the committee should retain an administrative co-chair. Several senators, including J. Gilbert, spoke in support of retaining both the ranking function and the administrative co-chair, citing institutional history and consistency with other Senate committees, and expressed concern about the Senate ceding authority under the "10+1" purview if ranking moved elsewhere without full clarity on how the new Planning and Resource Allocation Committee and Institutional Effectiveness Committee will operate.

e) Academic Renewal Policy Update, Jamie Salyer

❖ NOTES

- J. Salyer presented updated Academic Renewal language reflecting a change in Title 5 requirements, developed collaboratively with Crafton Hills College Counseling, aligning the related Administrative Procedure (AP). Key changes: the unit threshold to qualify for academic renewal was reduced from 24 to 12 completed units; the waiting period was

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reduced from two semesters to one; and the prior one-time-only limit was removed, allowing students to complete academic renewal more than once as needed. The change does not affect financial aid eligibility review, which continues to consider all attempted coursework. Admissions and Records has reviewed and supports the change.	1st: P.
