Starks mentioned that return to site plan should be discussed with your manager.</li> <li>The softball field, and the CTE building are all on schedule.</li> <li>The infrastructure planning on campus has started along with the underground maintenance, broken concrete, ramps, walkways, and fencing.</li> <li>S. Thayer spoke about Commencement is Wednesday May 26, 2021, at 9:00 am. It will be shown on YouTube, Facebook Live, and the SBVC Website.</li> <li>Over 1,600 students responded to participate in the virtual graduation.</li> <li>Students can get their vaccination on campus today.</li> <li>D. Humble said for fall there is a total of 1,728 sections, and 494 are in person. There are 100% lab classes, which totals 114 sections. The Hybrid classes have 134 sections, and 152 straight lecture classes, along with various in person classes that have 94.</li> <li>Summer currently has a total of 861 FTES and fall presently has a total of 127 FTES.</li> </ul>
Accreditation and Student Learning Outcomes - C. Huston	<ul> <li>C. Huston mentioned the three different types of Goals: the floor, the goal, and the stretch goal. If the institution falls below the floor, it will set an alert to monitor why the floor has fallen below.</li> <li>The enrollment-after application showed that enrollment was down in 2020 because of Covid-19, and changes on how the CCCCO collected data.</li> </ul>

Institutional Set Standards/Educational Master Plan/Strategic Planning- J. Oxendine	<ul> <li>J. Oxendine spoke about the results of the transition to campus survey that was sent out to the campus and to the students a couple of weeks ago.</li> </ul>
	• The Student Needs Assessment had about 1,180 responses. The majority of female was seventy-four percent and male were twenty percent. There were less responses from students under the age of 25 compared to the older students.
	<ul> <li>The most concerns upon returning to the campus from the students were contracting/transmitting Covid-19 to family members.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The Faculty/Staff Needs Assessment had about 233 responses. Sixty-two percent were faculty and thirty-eight percent were classified members or managers. Out of all the faculty respondents, fifty- two percent were full-time faculty and forty-eight percent were part-time faculty. The staff/managerial respondents, half were from Student Services.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The most concerns were not having enough control in maintaining social distancing, people not following mask protocol, monitoring possible Covid symptoms others might have, and maintaining proper ventilation in the buildings.</li> </ul>
Program Review – C. Huston/J. Oxendine	<ul> <li>C. Huston said the Program Review Committee really worked hard to make changes. Some of the changes were developing a non-instructional faculty form and changing the voting process to a point space scoring rubric to score online, to make the voting process easier.</li> <li>The Program Review Committee will be working with R. Hamdy to have a Program Review Committee Retreat at the beginning of the year.</li> </ul>
