



- 1. K-16 Learn to Earn:** In this grant, SBVC has partnered with REAL Journey Academies to create a teacher preparation pathway for dual-enrollment students
Awarded: \$800,000
- 2. Homeless and Housing Insecurity Program - Rapid Rehousing:** This grant provides housing navigation and placement services, academic support, and case management services to homeless students or those at risk of becoming homeless.
Awarded: \$796,656
- 3. San Manuel Band of Mission Indians:** The grant will continue the Tribe's long-term support of the SBVC Valley Bound Commitment program, as well as significantly expanding the Foundation's advancement capacity.
Awarded: \$2,200,000
- 4. California Earned Income Tax Credit Outreach Grant:** This initiative aims to disrupt generational cycles of poverty and enhance community outcomes by providing tax credits to both parenting and non-parenting working students.
Awarded \$5,000
- 5. NASA National Space Grant College and Fellowship Program:** This grant expands opportunities for Americans to understand and participate in NASA's aeronautics and space projects.
Awarded: \$25,000
- 6. Line Fire Grant:** This grant would give students experiencing hardship from the Line Fire up to \$500 in grant funds to immediately assist with housing, food, or other essentials.
Awarded \$10,000
- 7. Extreme Heat and Community Resilience Program - Small Implementation:** This grant was written to provide heat relief to San Bernardino Valley College through the addition of shaded cooling areas near the campus center with a pagoda, table, trees and benches with charging stations as well as hydration station water-bottle refilling areas throughout campus.
Awarded: \$449,400
- 8. Middle College High School Grant (non-competitive allocation):** The goal of this program is to select at-promise high school pupils who are performing below their academic potential and place them in an alternative high school located on a community college campus to reduce the likelihood they will drop out of school prior to graduation.
Awarded: \$131,142

- 9. K-16 Healthcare Grant, Round 2:** For this submission, SBVC and CHC have partnered with Pacific High School and Rialto School District to create multiple healthcare career pathways for from high school to community college and beyond.
Awarded: \$799,986
- 10. STEM Scholarships Grant:** This Grant provides STEM scholarships for SBVC students.
Awarded: \$25,000
- 11. Clean Energy/EV Tech Grant (Edison):** This grant supports the Clean Energy/EV Tech Program at SBVC.
Awarded: \$50,000
- 12. Clean Energy/EV Tech Grant (SoCal Gas):** This grant supports the Clean Energy/EV Tech Program at SBVC.
Awarded: \$20,000
- 13. Clean Energy/EV Tech Grant (Amazon):** This grant supports the Clean Energy/EV Tech Program at SBVC.
Awarded: \$10,000
- 14. Pathways to Success:** This grant is a sub-award from CSUSB and provides stipends to students for projects that they have undertaken. Stipends to faculty are also provided through this grant for mentoring, workshops and experiential learning opportunities.
Awarded \$35,534
- 15. CalFresh Grant:** This grant is a reimbursable grant to support basic needs services and is a 3-year allocation.
Awarded: \$171,888
- 16. Song-Brown Healthcare Grant:** This grant provides funding for the training of RNs in areas of unmet need, aiming to empower nursing students with the tools, support and resources necessary to excel in their academic pursuits and professional endeavors.
Awarded \$810,000
- 17. CCC Finish Line Scholars Program-SBVC:** This grant provides funding for scholarships or additional student aid as an emergency resource for those in need.
Awarded: \$150,000
- 18. Apprenticeship Pathways Demonstration Project Apprenticeship Pathways Demonstration Project:** This initiative is intended to provide community college apprenticeship program participants with a direct path to credit certificates and degrees. The apprenticeship funding is for our public health program in grant partnership with Crafton Hills College and AMR.
Awarded: \$99,000

- 19. Rebuilding Nursing Infrastructure Grant- Round 1:** This initiative seeks to increase the number of qualified nursing graduates equipped to enter the workforce and ensure the sustainability of high-quality healthcare for California residents.
Awarded: \$1,150,000
- 20. Rising Scholars Grant- Round 2:** This grant provides assistance and supportive services to students who have been previously incarcerated, or justice involved, helping them to discover a viable career pathway for lifelong success.
Awarded \$355,557
- 21. Environmental Educators Cohort Grant:** This grant supports educators leading the way in California schools' environmental learning and sustainability efforts. The project's title is "Enhancing Urban Biodiversity Through Native Plant Education."
Awarded: \$19,900
- 22. MESA Grant:** The MESA Grant supports the Student Success Center by paying for tutors, funds conferences which are attended by the students and purchase some items for the Student Success Center.
Awarded: \$410,656
- 23. Passport to Success:** This grant is the Health Professions Pathways Program UCR School of Medicine Passport to Success. It prepares students for careers to advance health equity in the Inland.
Awarded: \$20,000
- 24. Fresh Success Employment & Training Activities:** This grant is to support the operation of a Fresh Success CalFresh Employment & Training program to help low-income individuals gain skills they need to become more employable.
Awarded: \$625,426.33
- 25. Umoja Campus Programs Grant:** The Umoja program promotes a curriculum and pedagogy responsive to the legacy of the African and African American Diasporas. Umoja provides programming, curriculum, training, assessment, and knowledge sharing to colleges, strengthens relationships with transfer partner institutions, and cultivates Umoja programming with secondary schools.
Awarded: \$221,337
- 26. Song-Brown Healthcare Grant:** This grant will help support programs that train family care physicians, midwives, registered nurses and primary care nurse practitioners.
- Awarded: \$90,000

27. Strong Workforce Program (SWP): The SWP's goals are to 1) increase the number of students enrolled in programs leading to high-demand, high-wage jobs and 2) improve program quality, as evidenced by more students completing or transferring programs, getting employed or improving their earnings.

Awarded: \$180,000

28. H RTP 3 (EV/Tech Program): Under the H RTP grant, San Bernardino Valley College will provide training programs in Bidirectional EV Charging Station and Clean Energy Technology Pathway Programs.

Awarded: \$218,229.49

29. H RTP 3 (MAP/CPL): Under the H RTP grant, San Bernardino Valley College will provide a Mapping Articulated Pathways (MAP)/CPL Associate with the goal of developing a total of 30 CPL crosswalks that support the four priority industry sectors in collaboration with partner community colleges.

Awarded: \$191,100

30. CCC Finish Line Scholars Program-SBVC: This grant provides funding for scholarships, or additional student aid as an emergency resource for those in need. Our funding has been increased for the 2026-27 academic year in recognition of our recipients' strong completion outcomes (more than 90%). This is double our previous funding.

Awarded: \$300,000

31. Rebuilding Nursing Infrastructure Grant- Round 2: Round 2 of this program continues to build nursing education capacity for SBVC's ADN Program with an emphasis on launching new AND programs, as well as focus on strengthening faculty pipeline.

Awarded: \$1,511,831
