VPI Report	Dr. Humble provided an update on the new CurrlQunet Meta transition. We currently are moving right along in the transition. She also has met with the Honor's Faculty Lead about expanding the honors offerings. Please encourage your faculty in your areas to create honors courses.				
New Business	<ul> <li>Annual Training</li> <li>Title V requires all individuals involved in curriculum review and approval to be trained annually. It is our charge under AB1725 to approve new courses, delete existing courses, propose changes to existing courses, conduct a period review of course outlines, approve programs, delete programs, review programs requirements, approve course requisites, and assess curriculum, as needed. Curriculum is a process, and we follow our own established local processes, as well as State and Federal guidelines.</li> <li>What are we reviewing? <ol> <li>Appropriateness to the Mission – We sometimes gloss over our mission when reviewing curriculum. It's important to take the time to think about whether proposals fit in with the mission. Example: academic programs – are they preparing students for transfer? Are we fostering economic growth and global competitiveness? Improving the quality of life in the IE and beyond?</li> <li>Need – How do we define this? Vision for Success asks us to make data-based decisions. Labor market data, advisory committees, enrollment, transferability, equity, and integration into Guided Pathways. <ul> <li>Guided Pathways (GP) – Integrating Guided Pathways into curriculum work and to continue work on equity. What are we doing to integrate GP into curriculum? This will become more a part of what we do. We will be adding GP to the approval process and are considering adding the mapping to Meta.</li> <li>Curriculum Standards – Standards are laid out in the PCAH and our local Curriculum Handbook. We rely on discipline faculty for appropriate units, rigor, etc. The global perspective is still important. Who does curriculum "belong" to? We want to think about curriculum. 	Possible Meeting Change to in-person – There is a possibility that we have to move to in-person meetings beginning October 1 <sup>st</sup> . This is being mandated by the Governor's Order to take things from the emergency state to back to normal. This includes all meetings under the Brown Act. The ASCCC is aware of the concerns of the colleges, and they have contacted legal counsel with the Chancellor's			



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	office. Some legislation is moving forward to hopefully change this, so we may know more about this at our next meeting on September 27 <sup>th</sup> .			
<b>Ethnic Studies</b> – Janice provided a brief update on Ethnic Studies. We are still in the regular process of getting our Janice just did a submission of all of our curriculum for UC transferability in August.
