  - b. Curriculum Committee Training & Review
    - i. Presenters VPI Leticia Hector, Thomas Berry, Janice Wilkins, Kay Dee Yarbrough
    - ii. Training & Review Presentation The Curriculum Committee received a presentation titled Curriculum Committee Training & Review 2025, which provided an overview of the committee's authority, responsibilities, and processes under Title 5 and California Education Code. The training emphasized the Academic Senate's role in academic and professional matters (10+1) and outlined the authority of curriculum committees, local governing boards, and the Chancellor's Office. The presentation also reviewed the curriculum approval process, including technical and full committee review, and the five CCCCO criteria for course and program approval. Additional sections addressed member responsibilities, meeting management under the Brown Act and Robert's Rules, effective collaboration with faculty, and strategies for managing conflict. A "students-first" approach was highlighted throughout, reinforcing that curriculum decisions should prioritize student success, transfer, and equitable access. The session also covered articulation as a critical bridge to ensure curriculum alignment and smooth transfer pathways.
    - iii. The Curriculum Committee divided into groups to review items for Technical Review. Each team will review course proposals for descriptions, objectives, content, and out-of-class assignments. Members also signed up to attend Tech Review meetings for their respective areas throughout the semester.
