1. Approval of 10/26/2021 Minutes.	Ray Carlos moved; Stephanie Lewis seconded. Motion to approve Minutes as written passed.			
Enrollment Update a. Spring 2022 Registration b. Fall 2022 Enrollment Efforts	Dr. Rosas has requested reports for the phone banking campaign for spring—one report will list previously enrolled students who attended spring and summer 2021 but are not enrolled in fall 2021. The other report is fall 2021 currently enrolled students who have not registered for spring 2022 yet.			
	There are a few problems with the system reporting the daily snapshot comparing last year with previous years that is being worked on.	More emails and texts will be sent to students as well as digital ads.		
	We may need to expand hours for tutoring and offer tutoring in courses that students have difficulty passing so they can move on to the next semester.	This item will be explored further.		

3. Committee Collaboration	Basic Skills, Enrollment Management & Student Equity Committee merger was discussed. Dr. Humble presented the State Chancellor's Office updates via slides defining the SEA (Student Equity and Achievement) Program. Efforts are becoming more integrated, and the question is should we have the Basic skills Committee? Should we have Enrollment Management and Student Equity Committee? EDC 78222 (a) outlines why established, guidelines, etc. We still must submit the Student Equity Plan and Integrated Plan. Basic Skills plan is no longer required. We have been allocating funds from the SEA Program to Basic Skills and aligning with AB 705.	The Link to the State Chancellor's site to review the slides is: https://slideplayer.com/slide/16137101/
	A lot of colleges are shifting to align to the new SEA Program and its reporting efforts. SEA Program combines SSSP, Student Equity and BSI. The discussion is what it would look like to align our committee structure with the SEA Program and not combine. We want to do what is best for SBVC. Our committee structure was based on the old structure but that has changed so we need to look at possibly moving forward. All this work is under Guided Pathways, and we are integrated in our efforts and a vision for success.	
	Dr. Humble shared a link for San Diego Mesa College regarding the SEA Program efforts and showed a video on integration at Mesa. The question is do we want to do this for SBVC? Sophia asked whether anything would be taken from students like programs and Dr. Humble responded nothing would be taken from students. It all falls under Equity and Guided Pathways. Tutoring would be enhanced and would not go away.

Joanne questioned the statement about moving equity work from student services to the classroom and it doesn't sound like a joint effort. She suggested we really need to look at this carefully.

No timeline will be established until after further discussion.

Ray mentioned our success rates are not good and if this is going to help, we should move forward. Also, it may help get rid of some silos.

Dr Humble stated the San Diego Mesa website shows from silos to integration. It's about Guided Pathways and is a paradigm shift.

Aligning reporting structure with our committee structure is what the discussion is about, and the work won't change. We are meeting with the previous structure but are funded with the SEA Program now. There is some divisiveness on campus that should not be there, and we need to be working together to serve our students.

Dr. Lewis asked who looks at the proposals? Would everything come to this group for approval? Dr. Humble said Basic Skills looks at proposals now and allocates funds because AB 705 is in place, but it can be whatever we want it to be. The Basic Skills budget was aligned so it's easier for Carmen and Marco to do the reporting.

Discussion will be conducted again at the December 14 meeting.
