 2. Enrollment Update - Olivia & Dina a. Instruction b. Phone Banking 	1047 FTE's for Summer 2022 compared to 1369 last summer so summer is going fairly strong. 1704 FTE's for Fall 2022 compared to 3540 last fall but they are coming up slowly and we are halfway there. Phone banking will help these numbers and will begin in a couple of weeks. Dr. Humble reported the Board of Trustees will be receiving enrollment information as well.	Dean Carmen Rodriguez and Dean Marco Cota will again be taking the lead for Phone Banking. Bring Department materials to Sharaf and Justine if you have any to share for the Juneteenth Event.

Student Survey - Ray	A 90 day pulse survey was conducted with 46 responses that had mixed percentages. 43% more likely to enroll with mask and vaccination mandates lifted and online counseling, tutoring and chromebooks being most helpful.	Ray will continue to share the results of the Pulse Surveys.

 Student Equity Plan – Carmen Where we are and next steps 	Racial inequities is a new theme we are addressing with black students as our focus since data shows they have the highest gaps in enrollment and retention and success in English and Math. The first year of the plan is making sure everything is being done and the second year is being compliant and actionable with the entire campus providing feedback. The Plan is due November 30, 2022 and will go through 2025. It will be board approved at the November board meeting.	Larry Brunson and Veada Benjamin are taking the lead. Olivia suggested putting together a joint meeting of Asian and Pacific Islanders, Black Faculty and staff and Latino Faculty and staff, specifically to review the Student Equity Plan as several members of this committee were not involved in the original meeting and would like to supply feedback.
