1. Approval of 9/27/2022 Minutes	Christie motions to approve. April seconds. Change requested: add Michelle as attended to meeting. Motions approved with corrections: 6 yays and 4 abstentions.	
Fall 2022 Enrollment Update and Spring 2023 registration period	Dina provided an update on enrollment noting that we are above our targets and have leveled out at 3,955 FTES. We are hoping to match that for spring. Our total targets are just over 9,000 for the academic year. One major flaw is the ethnic studies classes are not appearing on the website schedule. Adjustments are being made. More classes are being added to accommodate students. Schedule is live. Kudos to the office of instruction for getting the schedule out one month prior to registration!	Dina will ask Kay Dee to provide the list of the state approved ethnic studies courses.

Registration begins October 31st with priority registration.

Summer dates are being finalized. Faulty chairs and division areas will start scheduling for summer and fall. Hopefully, by the end of the week. The academic calendar is pending board approval. Once that is done instruction can work on the schedule with faculty chairs.

Michelle commented that students are requesting late start classes for ethnic studies. Dina responded that instruction is in the process of recruiting full-time faculty for ethnic studies. The current ethnic study courses are the only ones being offered now.

Yvonne mentioned the subject of late start and waitlist practices. She mentioned that late start classes are very full. Even the waitlists are full. How are classes being advertised? Yvonne asked who she could email once waitlists are getting full?

Dina responded that each department has their own process. Late start classes are advertised. Student emails need to be directed to the division.

Yvonne asked if at any point emails can be sent directly to Dina.

Dina stated yes, we are here to serve the students. The protocol would be reaching out to the faculty chair and dean of the department first.

Yvonne asked who she would contact in student services when classes are available?

Ty provided that her and Michelle would be the liaisons Yvonne could contact. Liaison roles are listed in the online catalogs under divisions.

Christie noted that SAS has been updated on the main website, however, DSPS is still showing in the breadcrumbs under specialized counseling services. Larry added, thank you for bringing that to our attention, Christie. On the topic of the website, Keenan added that many changes are coming up with the website. Ty asked how many of the 1,000 students have seen counselors? Ty also asked for the list so that they can reach out to them.

Christie mentioned that somehow students are bypassing orientation and counseling. A very small number.

Keynasia added that she would like to reach out to the students to update majors.

Keenan suggested to discuss the issue of students selecting a major with the entire counselor body.
