- AB 705/1705 Updates: (Anthony Castro) Presented slide "Enrollment into Remedial Math Courses". Fall 2023, all remedial math courses will be removed from schedule. Math 962, Math 095 and Math 096 no longer offered. Also, presented slides Math 102, 103, 108, 115, 141, 151 "Recent Success and Retention Rates" and a summary of "Enrollment into Transfer-Level Math".
- (Joe Notarangelo) we are pleased to see AB 705 provides more options in terms of our English offerings. We've had a problem creating a transfer-level English 101 class that was accessible to everyone. We can offer a different Eng. 101 for those that do not want to transfer (like those that need only a certificate) that would be more appropriate for them. We can emphasize visual arts.
