STUDENT
LEARNING
OUTCOMES
(SLOS)?

SLOs are measurable skills or knowledge that your students can demonstrate once students finish your course.

WHAT DO I
NEED TO
WITH SLOS?

- Put SLOs on your syllabi.
- Make one or more assignments that measure each SLO.
- Enter SLO assessment data in the SLO Cloud at the end of the semester.

HOW OFTEN
DO I HAVE TO
ASSESS SLOS?

SBVC's policy is to assess every SLO in every section of every course in every semester. All faculty, both full-time and adjuncts, are required to submit SLO data each semester.

DO I GET PAID
TO DO SLO
WORK?

Yes, thanks to the union, all faculty are paid to do work relating to SLOs, including submitting data to the SLO Cloud.

HOW DO I
SUBMIT SLO
DATA?

WHEN IS SLO
DATA DUE?

Faculty are required to submit SLO data by the end of each semester. This is due at the same time grades are due on WebAdvisor.

WHAT
HAPPENS TO
SLO DATA?

Departments should look at SLO data to see if there are trends. Faculty should discuss SLO data to improve classroom practices.

FUN FACT

SLOs are part of curriculum, which means they are a faculty-led process. Each department has the autonomy to decide how SLOs will be assessed. Departments are encouraged to discuss shared assessments and rubrics.
