SBVC's policy is to assess every SLO in every section of every course in every semester. All faculty, both fulltime and adjuncts, are required to submit SLO data each semester.

Yes, thanks to the union, all faculty are paid to do work relating to SLOs, including submitting data to the SLO Cloud.

We submit SLO data to the SLO Cloud. Read more about the <u>SLO</u> <u>Cloud here</u>.

Faculty are required to submit SLO data by the end of each semester. This is due at the same time grades are due on WebAdvisor.

Departments should look at SLO data to see if there are trends. Faculty should discuss SLO data to improve classroom practices.

SLOs are part of curriculum, which means they are a faculty-led process. Each department has the autonomy to decide how SLOs will be assessed. Departments are encouraged to discuss shared assessments and rubrics.
