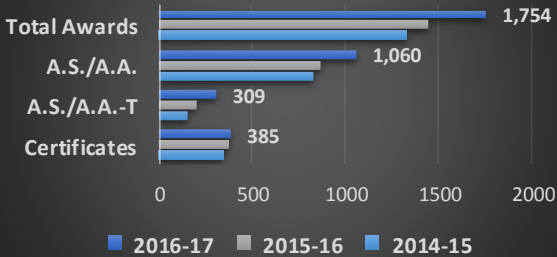
Mission

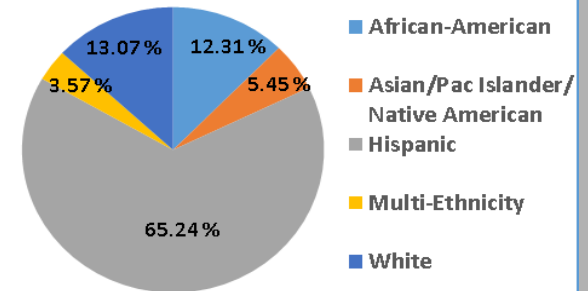

Average Age = 26

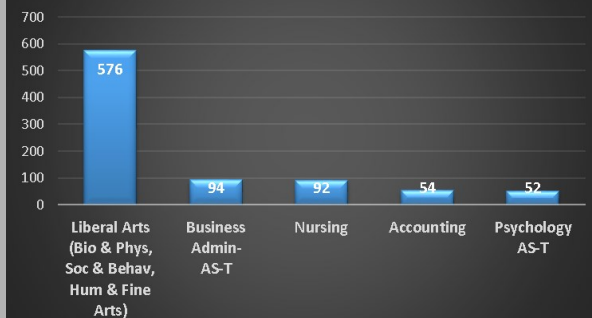

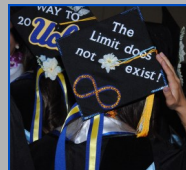
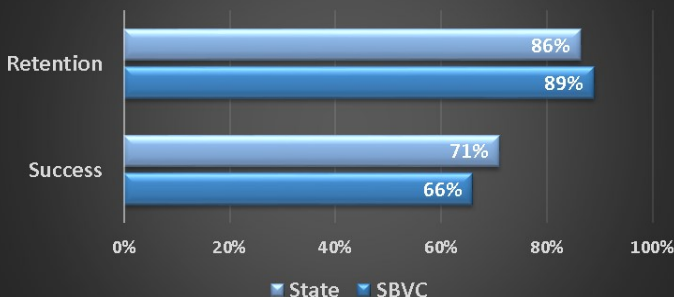

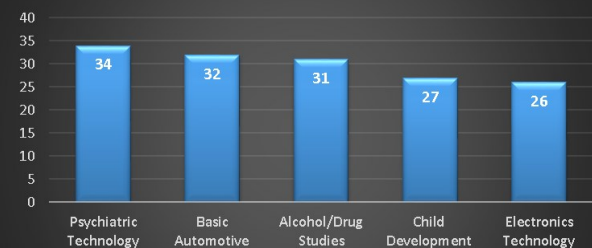
Top 5 Degrees - 2016-17
