We will allow students (gloved and masked) to sit at a piano for their Musicianship courses. And we will continue to offer in-person Piano and Guitar classes safely. We will persevere to continue providing high-quality music education for our students. It is in this vein I would like to share with you a few highlights of our programs, why we are special, and considerations as you make decisions about your academic future during this moment in history.

We are growing our programs at San Bernardino Valley College.
