On March 31, the Wolverine Cal-GETC event was held. This was a highly impactful, student-centered initiative designed to support students through comprehensive counseling services. 150 students attended and half of those students received direct assistance with preregistration for the upcoming summer and fall terms. This collaborative event brought together counseling staff and instructional faculty, creating an opportunity for students to engage directly with instructors across disciplines. Through meaningful conversations with faculty, students were able to make

more informed decisions about their course selections and counselors were available to conduct progress checks. This event exemplifies the strong partnership that has been built between Instruction and Student Services to ensure student success.
