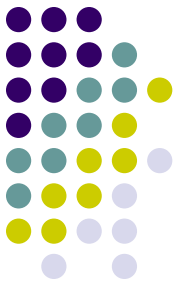

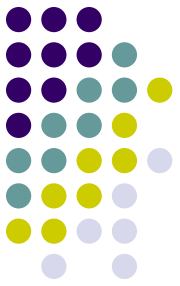

- Familial and Culture can often be found in *Handbook of Racial-Cultural Psychology and Counseling*

- Schizophren* AND Race

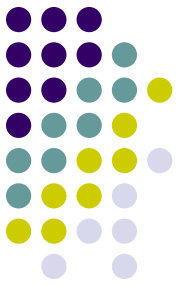
