	President's Report	J Stanskas welcomed the senators and guests to the meeting.  He highlighted the activities at the Senate retreat (of 8/12/09). One of which was to recommend that four topics be referred to the appropriate Senate Committees for action. The topics were; 1) Program Discontinuance (Ed Policy), 2) Management Hiring Process Review (Personnel Policy), Process for the election of representative senators (Elections & Student Services), Review the College/District Budget situation and planning (Financial Policy). Other subjects discussed at the retreat were; finalization of committee structure and reception of the Assessment for Placement study.  A reminder was made about the maintenance of the current committee assignments for the '09 - '10 academic year.  Final a review of the Academic Senate Meeting Norms was discussed.	Motion by C Huston, 2nd by P Buckley to refer Management Hiring Process Review to Personnel Policy. Voice Vote - Unanimous in favor.  Motion by A Aguilar- Kitibutr, 2nd by P Buckley to refer the remaining three items to their respective Senate Committees. Voice Vote - Unanimous in favor.  It was also recommended that Ed Policy work with Program Review on the Program Discontinuance topic.  J Stanskas also made the request that the Senate Committees charged with these topics should report back to the Senate in about a month.

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	Election of Secretary for '09- '10	M Ikeda's was nominated as a candidate by ? There were no other nominations.	A request was made to accept M Ikeda as Secretary by acclimation Voice Vote - Unanimous in favor.
3:17	Report of Assessment for Placement Study	J Smith presented a summary of the Report of Assessment for Placement Study. He reviewed the scope, methodology, and results of the study. (The study is contained in an attachment to these Minutes.)  During the question and answer period that followed several points were emphasized; 1) testing for placement equal higher retention, 2) placement scores from off-the-shelf classes aren't very predictive for higher level classes (e.g. English 101), 3) there might be an argument for offering a non-credit, Assessment Test preparation class, the results of the study seems to strongly argue for an increase in the number of basic skills classes being offered by the college.	
3:54	Proposed Committee Structure	J Stanskas led a review of the Committee Structure document (see attachment to these Minutes). The current Committee Structure was contrasted with the proposal brought forward by the Academic Senate, and the latest proposal the College Administration. It was noted that the two proposed Committee Structures suspended consideration of Program Review and Budget committees until the results of a meta-study become available to help in clarifying the responsibilities that may be encompassed by a committee or committees.  J Stanskas asked the Academic Senate to review the goals of the reorganization and to plan to take up this matter in the near future as a potential action item.
